**Notice of Temporary Traffic Control Plan  
SEVENTH ST at WEST STADIUM BLVD  
July 26 – September 4, 2010**

**Location and Limits of Affected Area:**

Seventh Street at West Stadium Blvd.

**Description of Work:**

As part of the West Stadium Improvements Project (Suffolk to Hutchins), the water main and sewer will be installed and the Seventh St Intersection will be reconstructed (new curb, sidewalk, and road pavement).

**Temporary Construction Traffic Control Plan:**

Construction across Seventh Street will take place in the period between the end of the Art Fair and the beginning of the school year. This construction will require the temporary closings of Seventh Street alternating between the south side and north side.

The south side closure will be first and is expected to last two weeks. During this time, northbound Seventh St will be closed at the intersection. Southbound Seventh St traffic will be permitted to turn westbound only at West Stadium Blvd. West Stadium Blvd traffic will only be able to travel westbound across the intersection.

The north side closure will follow the south side closure and is expected to last four weeks. During this time, southbound Seventh St will be closed at the intersection. Northbound Seventh St traffic will be permitted to turn westbound only at West Stadium Blvd. West Stadium Blvd traffic will only be able to travel westbound across the intersection.

Associated detours will be placed as shown on the attached drawing.

During this work the traffic may experience delays within and beyond the areas influenced by the construction. Motorists are advised to seek alternate routes. Traffic signs and other devices will be posted to notify and direct those approaching and traveling through the project work zone. To maintain the safety of all, please reduce speeds and drive cautiously. We thank you in advance for your patience as these necessary public infrastructure improvements are completed.
